Father Barone's Column

Among all the sacramentals which Holy Mother Church has provided to us, **Holy Water** occupies a special place. It is a blessed item with roots that go back to the Old Testament and whose presence in the life of the Church is evident from the earliest times. It fulfills, as a gift of the New Covenant, the dignity and power that God attached to the element of water in His promises and revelations to the people of Israel. Our Lord foreshadowed this sacramental in many of the miracles of His public ministry. It is a gift that has been placed in the hands of all the faithful by the Church, the divine institution which Our Lord Jesus Christ founded upon the earth for the salvation of all mankind.



Baptism, the fundamental moment in the life of every Christian, pivots around the element of water. Through this Sacrament, God makes use of water to infuse into the human soul the gift of supernatural grace, a participation in the divine nature, and adoption as a child of God. Thus, for every Christian, from the first moment of our spiritual birth and from the Church's constant preaching on the centrality of Baptism, *water* occupies a principal place in our supernatural thoughts and reflections.

Holy Water mirrors the power present in Baptism, though, being a sacramental, it does not confer the same graces as the Sacrament. Baptism removes evil from the soul and initiates the flow of sanctifying grace. Holy Water drives away the devil, who always seeks to return to this liberated soul, and helps to secure health for both the soul and the body, as the blessing placed on the holy water indicates.

Holy Water has, for millenia, been seen and used by the Church as a source of true and abundant spiritual and material blessings. Pope St. Gregory the Great taught missionaries that, after destroying the idols of an abandoned pagan temple, the sprinkling of Holy Water was sufficient to make the space suitable for Catholic worship. St. Teresa of Avila, who said that the devils were particularly afraid of Holy Water, also emphasized that Holy Water brought her "a refreshment which I cannot possibly describe, resembling an inward joy which comforts my whole soul." Holy Water has also been used by great Saints, like St. Patrick and St. Columba, to cure the sick and raise the dead.

It is not only in these benefits that we find peace but also in the fact that **Holy Water** brings the pardon of our venial sins. In this, Holy Water is a constant reminder of God's abundant grace and mercy. Thus, Holy Water is vital for a strong Christian life: it is a reminder of Baptism, a source of spiritual refreshment, liberation from the diabolical nuisance, and a constant invocation of God's mercy, allowing us to more easily traverse the difficult roads on our pilgrimage to eternal life.

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

Save the Date **October 25th Oktoberfest**



Born in Santa Lucia del Piave near Venice. Claudio was the voungest of nine children and was accustomed to hard work in the fields. At the age of 9, he lost his father. Six years later, he was drafted into the Italian army, where he served more than three years.

His artistic abilities, especially sculpture, led to studies at Venice's



in

Academy of Fine Arts, which awarded him a diploma with the highest marks in 1929. Even then he was especially interested in religious art. When Claudio entered the Friars Minor four years later, his parish priest wrote, "The Order is receiving not only an artist but a saint." Prayer, charity to the poor, and artistic work characterized his life which was cut short by a brain tumor. He died on the feast of the Assumption, August 15, 1947, and was beatified in 1994. His liturgical feast is celebrated on March 23rd.
