Father Barone's Column

How Did Christ Structure His Church? ~Fr. Barone

Kingdoms are run by a king. Kingdoms have a particular and hierarchical structure that are decidedly not egalitarian. Our Lord came proclaiming the arrival of the Kingdom of God.

This Kingdom was not created from nothing but constituted the fulfillment of the Old Testament (OT) Kingdom of David, which was promised to last forever (see 2 Sam 7) but seemed to have dissolved after the Babylonian Exile. Further, the Old Testament kingdom had a particular structure: the King, the Queen Mother, the Over-the-House (prime minister) who possessed the keys of the kingdom and ruled in the king's name (see Is 22); twelve governors to rule twelve districts of the kingdom (see 1 Kings 4).

The OT kingdom with its structure is fulfilled in Jesus, Mary, Peter (and his successors, the popes), and the twelve Apostles (and their successors, the bishops in union with the pope). The Church in the first century as represented in Acts of the Apostles was ruled hierarchically. See Acts Ch. 5 for a particularly vivid example of the consequences of lying to Peter.

The first council, held in Jerusalem (Acts 15), is also an illustrative example wherein a theological debate arose regarding circumcision. The Apostles gathered to discuss the matter, and after much debate, Peter stood up and definitively resolved the issue. There was no egalitarian walking together or "synodal process."

This hierarchically exercised authority was founded on the authority Christ gave them: "as the Father has sent me, so I send you (with authority)" (see Jn 20); and "all authority on heaven and earth has been given to me, go therefore..." (Mt 28:28).

If Christ intended a "synodal process," why has it taken 2,000 years to appear? If there's any confusion or doubt regarding how Christ intended to structure his church through the Apostles, we have the example of Saint Ignatius of Antioch, a disciple of the Apostles themselves and bishop of a major apostolic church. He certainly understood the structure of the Apostolic Church

Of the following quotes, does Saint Ignatius reflect a hierarchical or "synodal" Church structure?

"See that you all follow the bishop, even as Jesus Christ does the Father, and the priests as you would the apostles; and reverence the deacons, as being the institution of God. Let no man do anything connected with the Church without the bishop" (Smyrnnians, Ch 8).

"In like manner, let all reverence the deacons as an appointment of Jesus Christ, and the bishop as Jesus Christ, who is the Son of the Father, and the priests as the sanhedrin of God, and assembly of the apostles. Apart from these, there is no Church (Trallians, Ch. 3)."


