

Father Barone's Column

A Revived Ancient Carmelite Order Reviving Hope

On this Gaudete Sunday, where the penitential violet receives a more hopeful hue of rose, let's consider some good news in the life of the Church, especially in the midst of so much negative coverage.

In 2015, I met a man who was attending my annual Latin conference who believed he was being called to revive an ancient form of the Carmelite religious order, namely the eremitical (hermit) life based on the rule of Saint Albert of Jerusalem from the 4th century. He struck me as genuine, sincere, and determined to follow this vocation.

Over these last eight years, I've kept up with him periodically and followed the founding and development of his community. They opened up their first hermitage in Pennsylvania, and to my great surprise, had already opened up a second foundation in Colorado. While I always suspected they would be successful, I had no idea how successful they would become. They are receiving between ten and eighteen men annually to join their community.

Their life is exceedingly rustic and penitential. They have no electricity. No heating or cooling. They gather their own water. The following is their daily schedule: 12a rise; 12:15a-3a prayer (both chanted Divine Office and mental prayer); 3a-6a sleep; 6:15a mental prayer; 7:30a Divine Office; 8:15a Mass; 9:15a spiritual reading; 10a-1p manual labor; 1p Divine Office; 2p lunch and recreation; 3:45p Divine Office; 4:45p formation, manual labor, or study; 5:30p Divine Office; 6p mental prayer; 7p dinner (when not fasting); free time; retire by 9:30p.

I truly am inspired by these men retreating from a world of comforts to live a hidden life of prayer and sacrifice to pray for the Church and the world. In theory, it is easy to know and be hopeful in the fact that God raises saints precisely in difficult times. It is even more encouraging when one sees an example of God acting. For as chaotic as life in the Church currently is, it is difficult to recall what religious orders, even prior to Vatican II, were living a life this intense. We should trust that God truly is in control and is stirring the embers of renewal in the Church into a flame even now.
